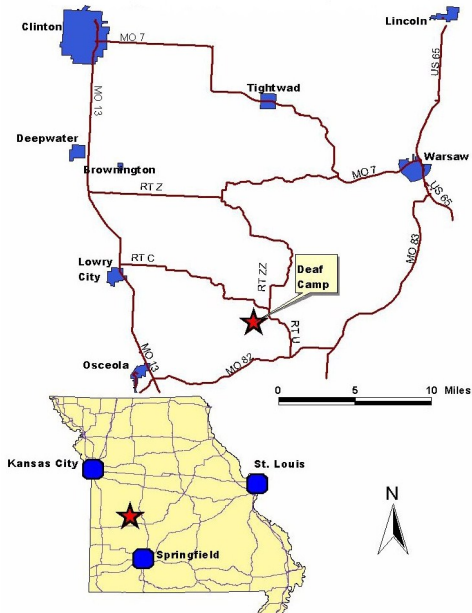
A packet with class schedule, directions, packing list and other pertinent details will be sent out approximately 2 weeks prior to camp.

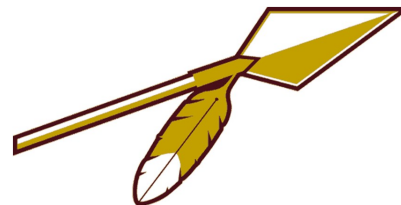

Outdoor Skills Camp for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children

Activities

Climbing Wall - Participants reach new heights as they learn to scale a 40-foot climbing tower. Campers gain confidence and learn problem-solving skills, as climbing the tower is harder than it looks. However, many of the campers scale it like they are Spiderman!

Shooting Sports - After a short safety lesson and then under the watchful eyes of conservation agents and hunter education instructors, campers fire pellet guns at clay targets. Most take home broken clays as souvenirs. Campers also participate in trap shooting.

Water Sports - When you go canoeing, there's always the risk of getting wet! Instructors teach campers basic paddling techniques and how to enter and exit without tipping the canoes and kayaks. Bring your swimsuit, too, because the pool will be open!

Archery - Instructors from the United Bowhunters of Missouri and the Compton Traditional Bowhunters introduce campers to traditional archery. After hitting the bull's eye a few times, nearly all the campers are addicted. Walking through the woods, campers also have the chance to shoot at 3-d animal targets.

Boat Ride - Enjoy a leisurely ride around the lake, guided by a local conservation agent. You might get the chance to see a variety of wildlife, including eagles,, deer and turkey, along the way.

Fishing - Anglers enjoy showing off their newly-learned skills. The majority of campers end up hooked on fishing and leave having caught at least one fish during the weekend.

Wildlife Identification—Ever wonder what animal made those tracks or what bird lost those feathers you found? Get an up-close and personal look at common Missouri wildlife.

Friendships —Campers have the opportunity to meet others from throughout the Midwest. Several participants are repeat campers who come to enjoy time with old and new friends.

All equipment is provided for the activities.
